With 39 career-oriented degree programmes in the four subject areas of Health Sciences, Information, Design & Technologies, International Business, and Life, Building, Environment and three Postgraduate programmes FH JOANNEUM is one of Austria's leading universities of applied sciences.

The degree programme Speech and Language Therapy provides students with sound professional knowledge and skills in healthcare along with scientific and social expertise. Graduates can either choose to enter the world of work straight away or proceed to a master degree programme at any university at home or abroad to specialise in their chosen field.

Prerequisites to be able to study in the programme and the yearly intake:

Entrance is by competition and the programme is always oversubscribed. Candidates require a higher education entrance qualification allowing access to university studies.

The intake is 15 students per year.

The content of the studies and the degree:

The Degree Programme consists of 12 modules, which are topic and method related. Career exploration in the second semester and the work placements in the third to sixth semesters complement the lectures. Supervision is offered from the first to the fifth semesters. Electives include related sciences which deal with relevant approaches from the fields of linguistics, education and psychology as well as speech and language disorders.

The two bachelor papers in the fifth and sixth semesters sharpen students' skills in scientific analysis when dealing with case specific questions. On completion of the six-semester course graduates are awarded the title "Bachelor of Science in Health Studies" (BSc).
