The Speech and Language Pathology Programme at Karolinska Institutet

Karolinska Institutet was founded by King Karl XIII in 1810 as an "academy for the training of skilled army surgeons". Today, Karolinska Institutet is a modern one-faculty medical university dedicated solely to the medical and health sciences with a reputation for top quality research and innovation and one of the foremost in the world. Approximately 6,000 students are taking educational and single subject courses at Bachelor and Master levels at Karolinska Institutet which have 14 undergraduate programmes except for the Speech and Language Pathology programme, for example dentistry, medicine, nursing, physiotherapy and occupational therapy.

The Speech and Language Pathology Program is a four-year program leading to a degree of Master in Speech and Language Pathology (one year). The annual intake is 28 students. Prerequisites for admission are passed degree in Swedish and English from upper secondary education and Mathematics B, Natural Sciences B and Social and Civic Sciences A. The first three terms of the programme contain courses in psychology, linguistics and phonetics and are given at the Stockholm University. In parallel with these courses the students are offered basic preclinical courses in different medical subjects and in training of their own voice and speech. Terms four to seven contain courses in speech and language pathology and consist of both theoretical courses and clinical placements. The program is organized under the Department of Clinical Science, Intervention and Technology, Division of Speech and Language Pathology.
