## 4. Abstract

Our SLT students follow a one-day-internship to observe the work of a SLT and otolaryngologist (doctor of ENT) in order to improve their understanding of the health care processes regarding individuals with voice problems in a department of otolaryngology at a university hospital (polyclinic).

During this internship, our students are becoming aware of the multi-professional community within the voice-polyclinic: they learn how SLTs, otolaryngologists and nurses collaborate, they observe an intake-interview, (voice-)examination(s) and consultations. In sum, they get involved in the decision making on how to provide the best care for a particular patient.

Additionally, the students have the opportunity to observe the work of an Otolaryngologist during operations concerning the voice box.

The internship is part of the minor program 'Centered Voice' ('*de stem centraal (NL)/ die Stimme im Mittelpunkt (D)*') within the school of speech and language therapy at the Hogeschool Arnhem en Nijmegen (HAN) / HAN University of applied sciences.
